The KITE Research Institute is the scientific arm of the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute and one of the principal research enterprises at the University Health Network (UHN), Canada's top medical research hospital with more than \$474 million in total annual research expenditures, 1,167 principal investigators and 4,664 publications (2022).

KITE, an acronym for Knowledge, Innovation, Talent, Everywhere, is a world leader in complex rehabilitation science with more than 100 scientists dedicated to improving the lives of people living with the effects of disability, illness and aging.

The institute's areas of focus include prevention of injury, restoration of function after injury and aging well. Researchers are actively engaged in developing new treatments, devices and products as well as gathering evidence that guides changes to policy and public opinion.

KITE's mission is to be a trailblazer in research, education and knowledge translation. It is home to 127 scientists and 181 scientific trainees who operate across five sites utilizing 56,000 square feet of research space.

About Our Program Presenters



The Rehabilitation Sciences Institute Temerty Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto

The Rehabilitation Sciences Institute (RSI), within the Temerty Faculty of Medicine and School of Graduate Studies at the University of Toronto, is the interdisciplinary doctoral stream training program for the Department of Occupational Science and Occupational Therapy, the Department of Physical Therapy and the Department of Speech-Language Pathology. The Institute, formerly the Graduate Department of Rehabilitation Science, was founded in 1995 to foster interdisciplinary graduate education and scholarship in Rehabilitation Sciences. The RSI is dedicated to the study of human function, participation and its relationship to health and well-being, and its mission is to prepare RSI students to be leaders through excellence in research innovation, knowledge translation and practice. The Institute currently has over 220 Faculty members and trainees based throughout the University of Toronto, including affiliated teaching hospitals and research institutes, such as the KITE Research Institute.

The RSI aims to address the urgent worldwide need to scale up rehabilitation science and practice due to major global trends (WHO, 2017). The research conducted at the RSI ranges from basic inquiry to knowledge transfer and are co-led by world-renowned Faculty and amazing trainees from a very broad range of disciplines. Students benefit from opportunities at the RSI that include collaborative programs in Life Course and Aging and most recently Robotics, in addition to ten other research areas. Our recent external review indicated that productivity among RSI-affiliated Faculty is "extraordinarily high", and the opportunities available to RSI graduate students is "unsurpassed, with active collaborations and interactions across a very broad range of areas and units" (External Review, 2020-21). The University of Toronto has been ranked first in the world in Rehabilitation Science based on publications and citations.

Event Location



The Carlu

Originally opened in 1930 as "Eaton's Seventh Floor," The Carlu was spearheaded by businessman Timothy Eaton. Lady Eaton, who aspired to bring high society and world-class culture to Toronto, was actively involved in the planning and design of Eaton's College Street and the Seventh Floor. To realize her desire for style and elegance, she commissioned famed French architect, Jacques Carlu.

Carlu was renowned for his masterpieces in the Art Moderne style, known as streamlined monumentalism for its clean lines and grand scale. The Seventh Floor exemplified this style in every element, including the colour palette, architectural details, artwork, room appointments, as well as the glorious Lalique fountain gracing the centre of The Round Room. In fact, it is said that the sheer beauty and unique shape of The Round Room may have inspired the design of The Rockefeller Center's iconic Rainbow Room.

In 2003, the space at 444 Yonge St. in College Park was reopened as "The Carlu" event venue after an extensive restoration. Now recognized as one of Toronto's best examples of Art Moderne architecture, The Carlu has been designated as a National Historic Site of Canada, and has played host to royalty on several occasions, as the preferred space for high profile social fetes, conventions, and corporate celebrations.
